

In the face of the opioid crisis, it's crucial that we come together to ensure the safety and wellbeing of our community members. Naloxone is an essential tool in reversing opioid overdoses, and drug test strips provide a means to detect dangerous substances before they cause harm.



We had a great meeting with Consul General of Germany David Gill to exchange ideas and discuss relations between our countries and New York State! (3/27/24)




Visitors in the Assembly Chamber

Troop 12



Foundation Aid

I joined my colleagues in government, superintendents, administrators and parents for a press conference at Three Village Central School District in opposition to Gov. Kathy Hochul's proposed revocation of the "hold harmless" provision of Foundation Aid, which will inevitably result in funding cuts to our schools. Some people have suggested the governor is using it as leverage during budget discussions. If that's the case, using our kids' futures as leverage is shameful. Districts will be left with several bad decisions to choose from: teachers and staff will be laid off, services and programs will be reduced or local property tax burdens will have to be increased if the governor gets her way. I said at the press conference, budgets are about choices. We are spending plenty of money on things and dipping into emergency reserves to offset the costs of asylum seekers in New York City.

If the governor was there, I would say to her, just as she said at the State of the State, "We can't spend money we don't have."

Well, we have the money for Foundation Aid, we just need to do a better job ensuring schools receive it.


