Assemblyman Phil Ramos co-hosted two gun buyback events in conjunction with Suffolk County Executive Steve Bellone, the Suffolk County Police Department and Suffolk County Crime Stoppers. The events took place in Brentwood and Central Islip and helped get numerous guns off the streets of Suffolk County.

The new law bans highcapacity magazines and
military-style assault weapons.

It also ensures all gun purchases
are subject to a background
check. Criminal penalties are
tougher for those who use illegal guns under the new law. It
also keeps guns away from convicted felons and out of the hands of those who pose a danger
due to mental illness.

Gun violence had become a sad reality in and around our community. Assemblyman Ramos is fighting to ensure that Suffolk families are safe from gun violence.

Summer Reading Challenge 2013

Assemblyman Ramos invites kids to take the challenge!

Assemblyman Phil Ramos' annual Summer Reading Challenge program is right around the corner. Every year, Assemblyman Ramos partners with our local libraries to encourage children to continue reading during the summer after the school year ends. Upon completion of the Summer Reading Challenge, children will receive a New York State Assembly Excellence in Reading Certificate.

To participate in the program, children must read by themselves or with a partner for a minimum of 15 minutes every day, for at least 40 days throughout the months of July and August. The days can be marked off on the calendar below and submitted to Assemblyman Phil Ramos, 1010 Suffolk Ave., Brentwood, NY 11717.

This program helps combat the inevitable decrease in learning—known as the "summer slide"—that takes place when young people are not in school during the summer. It is also a fun, inexpensive, and educational activity that can also provide quality family time and foster a life-long love of reading.

Summer Youth Employment Program

Assemblyman Phil Ramos announced that many job opportunities will be available for young adults through New York State's Summer Youth Employment Program in the coming months.

Through the Summer Youth Employment Program, Suffolk County will receive over \$850,000 to provide job opportunities to teens looking for work as the summer season kicks off. Funding from this program can be used to subsidize wages, support education and training activities, as well as counseling and employment-related services, like transportation to and from work or training.

To be eligible, applicants must be between the ages of 14 to 20. Additionally, only those teens whose families receive public assistance, or have a total annual income below 200 percent of the federal poverty level, or \$38,180 for a family of three, are eligible to apply. Assemblyman Ramos encourages all eligible youth to apply. Students from the local EOC-SNAP Division's Leaders of the Future Program (LOTF) recently took a trip up to Albany to meet with Assemblyman Phil Ramos and talk about the program. This comprehensive youth development-based after-school program, funded through a grant by the New York State Department of Health, works in collaboration with school districts to provide students with a safe atmosphere in which they can explore ideas, learn, experience personal growth, and develop key skills to help them navigate adolescence and early adulthood. The LOTF program runs in the Brentwood, Bay Shore, and Central Islip school districts at the middle and high school levels during the school year.
