Questions?

- Eliminates annual deductibles, co-payments and co-insurance payments for mammograms, breast ultrasounds and MRIs
- Requires clinics and hospitals to hold more screening hours to accommodate people who work full time

Most insurers start covering screenings at age 40, but many women develop breast cancer earlier. **Assemblywoman Jean-Pierre introduced legislation that requires insurance companies to cover mammograms starting at age 35** so more women can benefit from early detection (A.6731).

To further raise awareness, Assemblywoman Jean-Pierre introduced and helped pass a resolution to declare July 6, 2017, as **Got Checked Day** in the town of Babylon (K251).
