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I am Fighting to:

Protect Our Children

- ✦ Would strengthen protections for children by enacting the Jessica Lunsford Act, imposing a mandatory 25-years-to-life sentence for predatory sexual assault against a child and requiring electronic monitoring of offenders upon release. ([A.1384](#))
- ✦ Would require online platforms to give parents real screen-time controls, stop pushing harmful or illegal activity and end design features that trap young users in unhealthy levels of engagement. ([A.5114](#))
- ✦ Would require search engines to clearly label AI-generated results so New Yorkers know when the information they are seeing was created by artificial intelligence, helping combat misinformation, fake citations and unreliable content online. ([A.9091](#))

Stand with Law Enforcement and Firefighters

- ✦ Would increase the state income tax credit for volunteer firefighters and ambulance workers to \$2,500, honoring those who answer the call and strengthening the volunteer services our communities depend on. ([A.1064](#))
- ✦ Would support families of fallen police officers by creating a property tax exemption for surviving spouses so they can remain in their homes with dignity after an unimaginable loss. ([A.6532](#))
- ✦ Would prohibit individuals convicted of first-degree murder from being released on parole or otherwise, ensuring the most violent offenders serve the full life sentence their crimes demand. ([A.5116](#))

Combating Drug Use

- ✦ Would crack down on nitrous oxide abuse by prohibiting retail sales to the public, banning whipped cream chargers, establishing civil penalties for violators and expanding education on the dangers of misuse through Nima's Law. ([A.10923B](#))
- ✦ Would strengthen New York's drugged driving laws by authorizing oral fluid roadside testing, holding drivers accountable for refusing field tests or drug recognition evaluations and giving law enforcement stronger tools to keep impaired drivers off our roads and waterways. ([A.5271](#))
- ✦ Would protect young New Yorkers by prohibiting the sale of kratom to anyone under 21, requiring clear warning signage at retailers and imposing civil penalties on those who sell or provide kratom to minors. ([A.2699](#))
