

## **MAKING AN EFFORT TO SAVE LIVES:**

In 2013, Assemblyman Ra supported efforts to establish an emergency opioid overdose prevention program whereby officers are allowed to carry naloxone, an antidote to combat overdoses and save lives. During the 2014 legislative session, he also helped pass legislation to establish a drug addiction awareness and education program in order to guard against abuse.

## **EXPANDING CARE:**

With the overwhelming presence of drug abuse, Assemblyman Ra continues to advocate for necessary action to improve assistance for those who need it by providing options and more accessible treatment for addicts.

## A PRESCRIPTION FOR SAFETY:

Theft of prescription drugs through the mail has contributed to the influx of dangerous drugs finding their way onto our streets. That's why Assemblyman Ra passed legislation to restrict health insurers from mandating the use of mail-order pharmacies.
