## Protecting the Environment

*The rain barrel and E-Waste event was a huge success! In partnership with the NYC Department of Environmental Protection, the Lower East Side Ecology Center, and Queens Botanical Garden, we distributed 160 rain barrels to collect rain for watering lawns & plants, recycled over 240 e-waste materials to keep them out of landfills and gave out 250 bags of compost made from food scraps given away to renew gardens.*



## Getting to Know New Neighborhoods

*As many of you may know, at the start of 2023 new district lines will come into effect. Broadly speaking, the new 25th district will include portions of Parkway Village, Hillcrest Estates, and Briarwood. Over the past few months, I have started getting to know our new neighborhoods.*

*I toured St. John's University to check out the construction progress of the Health Sciences Center, which is supported by state funding and will house SJU's new nursing program. I also met with St. John's University's President Rev. Brian J. Shanley O.P. and discussed how we can work together to improve student life on campus. Earlier this year, I also met with teachers and students of Archbishop Molloy High School in Briarwood.*


## New Funding for Local Schools

*This year, I announced funding allocations of \$375,000 for the expansion and upgrading of Townsend Harris High School's new student publication center and music tech space, and a collective \$375,000 in technology upgrades for P.S. 154 and P.S. 120 which included the purchasing of computers and equipment for computer labs. Our students deserve state of the art technology to reach their full potential and academic goals.*



## Mobile Office Is Back!

*I brought back my mobile office hours to Flushing! I know that constituents do not always have the time to drop by my district office so bringing back my pre-pandemic mobile office setup at Selfhelp Benjamin Rosenthal Senior Center every Wednesday from 10 am - 11 am was top on my to-do list. The mobile office will offer assistance and provide local residents the opportunity and convenience to share concerns face-to-face without leaving their neighborhood. Assistance will be available in Chinese as well.*



## Funding a New Teacher Center

*I had a great time at the unveiling of the new UFT Teacher Center at P4Q in Fresh Meadows with Chancellor Banks and Council Member Lee. Thanks to state funding, this center will serve as a year-round facility for teachers who need extra educational resources and quality space to continue their professional development.*

## Utility Rights Training

*Knowing that a lot of constituents are not able to afford their utility bills—a reality exacerbated during the economic downturn and by the pandemic—I hosted a Know Your Utility Rights Training. The session led by the Public Utility Law Project shared the best practices and covered financial assistance programs available.*

## Remembering a Local Hero

## Strengthening Holocaust Education in Schools

Governor Kathy Hochul signed my legislation that will ensure that students across New York are receiving adequate education on the Holocaust. A 2020 study showed that among New York millennials, 58% cannot name a single concentration camp, 19% believe that Jews caused the Holocaust, and 28% believe the Holocaust is a myth or has been exaggerated. This new law will help us teach the next generation what happens when hate goes unchecked.

## Fighting for Flexible Working Conditions

As the COVID-19 pandemic has exposed a new reality, I have been fighting to ensure workers have the option for flexible and remote work wherever possible. Remote work and flexible hours are crucial for working families to balance child care and health concerns. Data has shown that it does not impact worker productivity. That's a win-win situation in my book and I'm committed to pushing for progress.
