

## What are the Common Core State Standards?

The federal government in 2001 required states for the first time to establish a learning model that outlines what students in grades 3-8 and high school should know. In response to this mandate, New York State adopted the Common Core standards, a set of standards developed by the National Governors Association, the Council of Chief State Officers and other educators, in 2010.

## What is the problem?

Teachers, parents and school administors have expressed their concerns over the flawed and rushed implementation of Common Core educational standards and testing.

## Assemblyman Jeffrion L. Aubry: 2014 Reforms to Common Core will help students succeed

- Sans Common Core testing for grades pre-K−2
- Prohibits schools from using state assessment test scores to determine student promotion in grades 3-8
- Protects sensitive student data and creates a Parents Bill of Rights, ensuring data privacy
- Delays for 2 years, the use of grades 3-8 Common Core test scores as a factor in teacher evaluations
