
In 2024, 243 New Yorkers have been killed by traffic violence.

Here's how we are fixing it

To put an end to senseless traffic violence, my office is:

- Calling on the Mayor to <u>enforce the NYPD's Patrol Guide</u>, ending deadly high-speed chases³;
- Supporting daylighting and traffic calming measures to make our streets safer4;
- Pushing to complete the installation of the 31st Avenue Bike Boulevard⁵;
- Continuing to advocate for the immediate <u>opening of the Queensboro Bridge's South</u> <u>Outer Walkway</u>⁶;
- Championing my legislation authorizing <u>camera enforcement of protected bike lanes</u> (bill A4637);
- Pressuring the Mayor to <u>fully implement Sammy's Law</u> to reduce speed limits to 20 mph across all five boroughs (bill A7266);

→WHY IS IT THIS BAD?

We are witnessing an epidemic of traffic violence.

Five Astoria and Long Island City residents have been killed in 2024 so far, making this year the deadliest year on record over the past decade. This is no coincidence: our leaders have failed to treat this as the crisis it is.

The Mayor has abandoned our city's cyclists, pedestrians, and drivers. Since 2022, he has refused to build the legally mandated amount of protected bike lanes, on average roughly 20 miles fewer per year than the requirement. Without this critical safety infrastructure, cyclists face an increased risk of death or injury. Additionally, the NYPD under the Mayor's watch has ramped up deadly high-speed chases—up 644% from 2022 to 2023—which have killed three New Yorkers in 2024 alone, including our very own neighbor Amanda Servedio.² These chases violate the NYPD's own patrol guide. Moreover, the Mayor has done little to reduce speed limits across the five boroughs or increase daylighting and traffic calming measures across NYC—failing to use the full sweep of tools available to the city to change road design and slow motorists down.

Astoria and Long Island City residents deserve better.
