## Assemblyman Kim: All eligible voters can vote by absentee ballot for the June 23 elections



To ensure no one has to risk their health to make their voice heard, **New York is sending postage-paid absentee ballot applications to all eligible voters to vote by mail in the June 23 primaries.** When filling out the application, simply check the box for “temporary illness or physical disability.”

**Voters will receive ballots and postage-paid envelopes to send their completed ballots back.**

**Mid-May:** Absentee ballot applications will be sent to all eligible voters with postage-paid envelopes to return.

**June 16:** Last day to mail in an absentee ballot application.

**June 22:** Deadline to postmark absentee ballots.
