Our goal is to match volunteers and clients who are living in roughly the same neighborhoods whenever possible.

Friendly Visits can take place during the daytime and/or in the early evenings. Volunteers provide companionship and assistance with very light household tasks/projects such as home organizing, putting up shelves, or learning basic computer skills. Volunteers and seniors go for walks, play games, cook together, chat about music, art, sports, movies, TV shows – it really depends on the two people involved! We are also looking for volunteers for our Medical Escort program which involves helping clients get to and from their appointments on various modes of transportation – Access-a-Ride, subways, buses and car services. This is a good fit for volunteers with weekday flexibility who prefer not to make a long term commitment.
