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Antisemitism Has No Home In Our City

For centuries, our city has been a melting pot for different cultures, ethnicities and religions from across the world. In recent years, however, that dynamic has been threatened by a dramatic rise in antisemitic hate crimes.¹ As a Jewish New Yorker myself, I understand this struggle firsthand. Our city deserves leadership that celebrates the contributions of Jewish communities and stands up against hate.

That's why I've supported policies that would:

- Prohibit funding to higher education institutions that allow antisemitism on campus. (A.4797)
- Implement mandated training, require reporting on antisemitic incidents and prohibit state funding to institutions failing to comply. (A.2376)
- Prohibit not-for-profit corporations from engaging in unauthorized support of Hamas and nations known to fund Middle Eastern terrorist group activity. (A.5214)
- Require an arrest when a police officer has reasonable cause to believe a hate crime has been committed. (A.4766)
