#### **LEGISLATION SIGNED INTO LAW**



Two weeks ago, the Governor signed three of Alex's bills:

**A8435** – Have you ever found government technology to be slow and out of date? One reason is that the State relies on old mainframes instead of embracing cloud technology when it enables faster improvements. This bill requires every agency to plan their technology purchases to ensure the state government provides effective services to New Yorkers. **A8081** and **A8425** – Everyone deserves to be addressed respectfully and

These two bills cleaned up old New York statutes that led to offensive terms toward Asian Americans being used in our courts daily: one requiring the identification of a defendant's "color of skin" and another inaccurately referencing a Japanese martial art weapon as being Chinese.
