
LEGISLATIVE UPDATE

Al for business regulations

Working with former Stanford researchers and using a speciallydesigned AI tool, Alex reviewed the entire New York Law code looking for outdated statutes. The laws ranged from ridiculous to offensive to dangerous, and he recently published an op-ed with the New York State Business Council on the need to streamline New York's laws and regulations.
