LEGISLATION PASSED



End of Session 2026:

For the 2026 Session, Alex passed 12 bills. Three are signed and nine are awaiting action from the Governor. The bills below were newly passed since our last newsletter.

Training Data Transparency (A6540):

The makers of large AI models should tell users the basics of what data went into training them. Assemblymember Bores passed a bill, the strongest in the nation of its kind, that requires AI companies to tell you what data they're using for training, giving the public better insight into how AI operates.

Content Provenance Labeling (A6578): We're one step closer to trusting what we see on the internet. Alex has passed a bill requiring all AI companies to label images they make as AI-generated; content that you see on social media and elsewhere on the internet will have to tell you where they came from. This will help with the alarming rise of fake news and fake images online.

Chatbot Safety (A10379): Chatbots should not be able to provide dangerous features to children. Alex passed a bill to ban chatbot operators from offering unsafe features — encouraging suicide, engaging in sexual messaging, and more — to children under 18. With stories about chatbots forming improper relationships with kids coming out almost daily, New York will lead the way in reining them in.



Knickerbocker Greys Update: Back in the Armory

The Knickerbocker Greys are back in the Park Avenue Armory! Despite the Armory suing to block a law Alex and Senator Krueger passed that would stop the Greys eviction from their historic home, a judge granted the Greys use of the armory while the court case continues.

Assemblymember Bores partnered with ICNA Relief and Muslim Volunteers for New York to give away 100 backpacks stuffed with school supplies to our neighborhood's youngest scholars. The Assemblymember joined the Green Park Gardeners for a volunteer shift along the East River Esplanade. The group's pesticide-free garden has been a certified Monarch Waystation since 2016, supporting one of nature's most essential — and endangered — migrations. They also inspected the Greenway plumbing issues and discussed ways to make it even more vibrant.
