In October, we break the silence and raise awareness of domestic violence. In New York City, we can count on Safe Horizon, specializing in crisis intervention and serving as a safe place for those in need of support, protection, and justice. Safe Horizon can be reached at 1-800-621-4673.

A new law, taking effect next week that I am proud to have cosponsored in the Assembly will reinforce New York's zero-tolerance policy for domestic violence. Assembly Bill 5614 permits victims to recover non-economic as well as economic damages from any and all defendants found liable by a court or jury, after a trial on the merits of the action. Another new law I was proud to support in the Assembly (A.4467), taking effect allows victims of domestic violence to make reports to any local law enforcement agency in New York State. Currently, a victim of domestic violence may have to retreat for his or her own safety and, in certain cases, go out of the law enforcement jurisdiction for protection. This causes incidents to go unreported or forces the victims to return to the same jurisdiction, putting the victim at risk of further harm from their abuser. As this law takes effect, we are expanding the opportunity for cases of domestic violence to be thoroughly investigated and holding offenders accountable for their crimes.


