

Dear Mayor DeBlasio:

This letter is written on behalf of my constituents regarding John Jay Park, a very popular and highly regarded park in Brooklyn. I have received many calls that it has become a reliable refuge for swimming and playing during the summer months. I am expressing concern with the resupplying of 35 public pools, but more so regarding visiting hours.

According to the New York City Parks Department, the pools chosen to reopen will provide the best geographic coverage across the five boroughs. However, the pools in Harlem, Weehawken and Morrisania parks, which are located in my 18th Assembly District, have been closed since March 17, 2020 due to low usage rates, which are zero. Weehawken would have to treat about 50 pools. In order to ensure our residents need not sit at risk of COVID-19, we must open all pools in the 18th Assembly District.

The John Jay outdoor pool does not serve as a COVID-19 testing or distribution site and have little capacity. The outdoor pool measures 100' x 40' inches, 8' walls, and is well and deeply secured measurements. The John Jay indoor pool measures 50' x 25' inches, 8' walls, and is well and deeply secured measurements. We must immediately open all pools in the 18th Assembly District, and return them to their residents.

John Jay outdoor pool does not serve as a COVID-19 testing or distribution site and have little capacity. The outdoor pool measures 100' x 40' inches, 8' walls, and is well and deeply secured measurements. The John Jay indoor pool measures 50' x 25' inches, 8' walls, and is well and deeply secured measurements. We must immediately open all pools in the 18th Assembly District, and return them to their residents.

I urge you to reopen all pools in the 18th Assembly District, and return them to their residents. Your leadership is crucial to our safety and health. Please take every step to ensure that our families can enjoy a recreational moment. I urge that New York City consider reopening water parks before the accessible summer ends. Thank you for your leadership during these challenging times and for your consideration of this matter.

After hearing the feedback of constituents who want to see the opening of John Jay Pool, our office looked into the issue and found that the only two public pools opened in Manhattan are both in Harlem, and within a ten minute walk of each other. The nearest pool to our neighborhood is 50 blocks away. **Dear Mayor de Blasio:**

I am writing to you regarding the proposed Asaph Green residential development project, the largest project that provides high-quality, safe, and affordable housing for New York City residents. Asaph Green is a non-profit organization that has chosen to break away from its previous model of requesting city subsidies, a model that Asaph Green critics have called "rent control by stealth," and instead propose to build its first residential building in New York City using private funds and city tax credits under the City's P-40 rezoning.

Asaph Green has submitted a detailed, safe rezoning plan to City Hall. However, no guidance or training is currently available to help Asaph Green and other non-profits navigate the complex zoning and permitting process, as well as the challenges of finding a suitable location for their projects and implementing social distancing measures in place. The legal height of Asaph Green's proposed site at the Upper East Side is 12 stories, which is the maximum allowed under the current zoning. Asaph Green is seeking a variance to allow for a taller building, which would require significant engineering work, including taking off 10 stories and adding 10 stories to meet the health and ergonomic exercise needs.

Asaph Green has the bandwidth to add off-site staff. In addition, they have reached no more than 10% of their funding goal. Asaph Green is currently working to secure additional funding to move forward throughout New York City. The City's "problematic" homelessness crisis continues with no new solutions in New York City. Asaph Green's proposed project will provide safe, decent, and accessible housing immediately so organizations like Asaph Green can repair safety. I look forward to and appreciate your response on this critical project.

Additionally, the non-profit Asphalt Green's indoor pools are closed due to the City's decision to break away from State guidance to safely re-open indoor pools. Asphalt Green is equipped to operate with large spaces, ventilation, and social distancing measures. The pools are essential for teaching life-saving swimming lessons to children, and to provide a means for adults to exercise. Over 600 people have been furloughed since march and there is no timeline provided for the potential re-opening of indoor pools and recreation

Over the past several weeks, our office has been inundated with emails and phone calls regarding the police barricades located in Carl Schurz park and the East River Esplanade. Throughout these difficult times my constituents use Carl Schurz as a resource for leisure, but due to the barricades their access to the park has been limited.

According to my constituents the barricades are limiting their access to the water fountains, the dog runs, and are even disrupting their commutes home. Also, my constituents have expressed their concern of the inability to social distance safely due to the limited space in the park because of the presence of the police barricades.

## Statement on the Arrest of Nikki Stone

*"I am appalled by the arrest of Nikki Stone, a transgender 18-year-old protester at a peaceful protest on July 29th at 2 Avenue & East 25 Street.*

*It is vitally important for the younger generation, teens like Nikki Stone, to be involved in protest without fear of retribution. She was confronted and detained by plain clothes officers driving an unmarked vehicle, while practicing their First Amendment right to freedom of speech. The means by which she was arrested are reminiscent of tactics used by federal authorities who clashed with demonstrators in Portland, Oregon in response to the murder of George Floyd.*

*The police have been historically hostile with the transgender community. More than one-fifth (22%) of transgender people who had interacted with police reported police harassment, and 6% of transgender individuals reported that they experienced bias-motivated assault by officers. On a personal note, I am a proud ally for the LGBTQ+ community and have helped pass crucial legislation for this community. In 2016, I helped pass GENDA Bill A4558-B in the fight to protect the transgender community from discrimination.*

*In the Assembly we are fighting for the passage of the Walking While Trans Ban, Assembly Bill 00654, which repeals the law relating to loitering for the purpose of prostitution. The current statute hurts the LGBTQ+ community, specifically those of color, at a disproportionate rate. Disturbingly, this statute, which has been in effect since 1976, has been utilized more in recent years. The Human Rights Campaign estimated a 120% increase in arrests under this statute in 2018 in New York State, with 91% of people arrested being black or Latinx, and over 80% being women.*

*On June 16, 2020, I hosted a virtual town hall on the topic of LGBTQ+ Activism & Advocacy with special guest speakers, Judith Kasen-Windsor, LGBTQ+ Activist and Advocate, Jevon Martin, from Princess Janae Place, Melissa Sklarz, Senior Government Relations Strategist Sage at Services & Advocacy for LBGT Elders, Dolores Covrigaru, Greater NY Political Co-chair of Human Rights Campaign, and David Kilmnick, President & CEO of The LGBT Network.*

*I have also worked with my colleagues in the Assembly to pass the historic 'Say their Name' Legislative package including the repeal of 50-A and a proud cosponsor*

*and strong supporter of the ‘Less is More Act’ (A5493) to facilitate the positive reintegration of people who are under parole and reduce the number of people in New York State prisons and jails. We will not stop advocating for increased trust and positive community-police interactions.*

*We must stand up for our LGBTQ+ friends and constituents, especially when they are advocating for important intersectional issues such as racial justice,” said Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright.*

## WHAT ARE MY RIGHTS TO A HEARING?

- IF YOU HAVE BEEN DENIED UNEMPLOYMENT BENEFITS, YOU ARE ENTITLED TO A HEARING.
- YOU CAN APPLY FOR A HEARING ON THE DOL WEBSITE
  - SIGN IN TO YOUR NY.GOV ACCOUNT. CHOOSE "GO TO MY ONLINE FORMS." UNDER THE "FORMS AVAILABLE FOR FILING" MENU ON THE LEFT, CHOOSE THE "CLAIMANT REQUEST FOR HEARING" FORM. PLEASE FILL OUT THE FORM COMPLETELY AND SUBMIT. INCLUDE WHY YOU DISAGREE WITH THE DETERMINATION, FOR ASSISTANCE CALL VOLs.
- YOU MUST REQUEST YOUR HEARING WITHIN 30 DAYS OF RECEIVING A NOTICE OF DETERMINATION. KEEP A RECORD OF YOUR APPLICATION FOR A HEARING.
- YOU HAVE A RIGHT TO LEGAL REPRESENTATION AT THIS HEARING.
  - IF YOU HAVE NOT OBTAINED LEGAL REPRESENTATION AT THE TIME OF YOUR HEARING, YOU MAY REQUEST AN ADJOURNMENT, I.E., POSTPONE THE HEARING UNTIL YOU FIND REPRESENTATION. ASKING TO POSTPONE THE HEARING IS NOT AN INDICATION OF GUILT.

WHAT IF I WANT TO APPEAL MY WEEKLY BENEFIT RATE?

WHEN YOU RECEIVE YOUR NOTICE OF DETERMINATION, IT WILL INDICATE YOUR WEEKLY BENEFIT RATE. IF YOU DISAGREE WITH THIS RATE, YOU ARE ENTITLED TO REQUEST A RECONSIDERATION AND A HEARING.

TO REQUEST A RECONSIDERATION, USE THE REQUEST FOR RECONSIDERATION FORM ONLY IF:

- (1) THE WAGES SHOWN ON THE FORM ARE WRONG OR
- (2) YOUR EMPLOYMENT AND EARNINGS ARE MISSING FROM THE BASE PERIOD.

YOUR REQUEST FOR A RECONSIDERATION MUST BE RECEIVED WITHIN 10 DAYS OF THE MAIL DATE ON THE NOTICE OF DETERMINATION. KEEP A RECORD OF YOUR APPLICATION.
