This Memorial Day may we never forget those who made the ultimate sacrifice for our freedom. Enjoy the day with your loved ones, and don't forget to think about those who served and sacrificed. Our community office will be closed in observance of the legal holiday on Monday, May 29 and will re-open at 9:30am on Tuesday, May 30.

Tennessee State Representative Justin J. Pearson was one of the "Tennessee Three" who stood up in the "people's house" in protest of gun violence. He was one of two Black men removed from the legislature for their actions. After being reinstated, he continues to stand up to discriminatory and anti-democratic attacks. We are so proud he visited the New York State Assembly, the "people's house" in Albany.

As Chair of the People With Disabilities Committee, I co-hosted a roundtable with my colleagues to address the youth in crisis who are facing long term stays in their local hospital emergency rooms. The conversations have only begun about this issue and we look forward to coordinating with agencies to ensure comprehensive evaluation of patients and wraparound services to help these youths find appropriate placement.

This week, we held the second in a series of rent freeze clinics at the community office. Rent increases are looming for New York City's rent stabilized tenants. If you are a rent stabilized senior citizen or person with a disability, please check your eligibility for the Senior Citizen Rent Increase Exemption (SCRIE) or the Disability Rent Increase Exemption (DRIE) programs.

Enclosed in this report you will find resources connecting you with State services including the HEAP cooling benefit, the Excelsior Scholarship Program for graduating high school seniors, New York State's Job bank "JobZone" and more. Additionally, see the notices about upcoming events like concerts and movies in the park.

Seawright Co-Hosted A Youth In Crisis Roundtable To Address Longterm Stays For Children In Emergency Departments



Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright, Chair of the People With Disabilities Committee along with her colleagues Assembly Members Marianne Buttenshon, Aileen Gunther, Chair of the Committee on Mental Health, Andrew Hevesi, Chair of the Committee on Children and Families, co-hosted a Youth In Crisis Roundtable.

The rountable attended by representatives from the State Department of Education, the Office for People with Developmental Disabilities, New York State Office of Mental Health and the New York State Office of Children and Family Services was developed as a result of meetings with local providers, school leaders, and agencies regarding the crisis of local youth having long term stays in hospital emergency departments.

Discussions included safe living for youth, fulfilling the need for wrap-around services, providing targeted programs for in-crisis youth as well as early intervention preventative

measures and mental health services. It was determined that there are further needs for safe living and supportive services.

How To Freeze Your Rent

Our office hosted the second of a series of rent freeze clinics for senior citizens and people with disabilities.

The NYC Rent Freeze Program, which includes the Senior Citizen Rent Increase Exemption (SCRIE) Program and the Disability Rent Increase Exemption (DRIE) Program, helps those eligible stay in affordable housing by freezing their rent. Under this program, a property tax credit covers the difference between the actual rent amount and what you (the tenant) are responsible for paying at the frozen rate.

New York State Excelsior Scholarship Program



The Excelsior Scholarship, in combination with other student financial aid programs, allows students to attend a SUNY or CUNY college tuition-free. The program covers tuition for eligible SUNY and CUNY students. For the 2023-24 academic year, families who earned \$125,000 or less are eligible to apply.

Thomas Ristenpart: Mitigating Technology Abuse in Intimate Partner Violence

CONVERSATION

As our lives becomes increasingly reliant on digital technologies such as smartphones, email, and social media, the threat of their being used against us looms large. In this talk, Thomas Ristenpart will discuss a context where weaponization of technology against people is tragically routine: intimate partner violence (IPV).

Ristenpart is part of a research group that has studied the role technology plays in IPV situations. Via interviews with survivors and support professionals, online measurement studies, and investigation of malicious software tools purpose-built for abuse, they have documented how abusers exploit technology to control, harass, stalk, and otherwise harm their current or former partner. To help survivors, they work with technology companies and lawmakers to affect positive changes and, more directly, have put into practice a new interventional approach that they call clinical computer security. Their Clinic to End Tech Abuse works in partnership with the New York City Mayor's Office to End Domestic and Gender-Based Violence to help survivors navigate technology abuse and, ultimately, empower their use of technology. This talk will cover joint work with a large number of collaborators and clinic volunteers.

ABOUT THOMAS

Thomas Ristenpart is an Associate Professor at Cornell Tech and in the Computer Science Department at Cornell University. Before joining Cornell Tech in May 2015, he spent four years as an Assistant Professor at the University of Wisconsin-Madison. His research spans a wide range of computer security topics, with a recent focus on cloud computing security, as well as topics in applied and theoretical cryptography. His work has been featured in numerous publications including the New York Times, The MIT Technology Review, ABC News, and U.S. News and World Report. He completed his Ph.D. at UC San Diego in 2010. His awards include the UC San Diego Computer Science and Engineering Department Dissertation Award, an NSF CAREER Award, the Best Paper Award at USENIX Security 2014, and a Sloan Research Fellowship.

The new NYC Ferry Summer & Holiday Schedule changes will go into effect beginning Monday, May 22, 2023.

NYC Ferry Riders can transfer from the South Brooklyn Route to the Governors Island Shuttle at Wall St/ Pier 11. Governors Island will remain on the South Brooklyn Route on weekdays)

- Rockaway Summer Schedule changes begin May 30

Queens bound F-Train MTA Alert

Due to scheduled MTA work there will be no Queens bound F-Trains from Manhattan to Roosevelt Island starting Friday, May 26th at 11:45PM to Tuesday, May 30th at 5:00 AM (F-Train service from Roosevelt Island to Manhattan will remain on a normal schedule). To help accommodate Roosevelt Island residents who are returning from Manhattan, RIOC's Transportation Department will be providing a Shuttle Bus to and from Manhattan from Saturday, May 27 - Monday, May 29, 2023.


The Roosevelt Island Shuttle Bus to Manhattan will start at 3:00 PM. The shuttle will depart hourly from the Tramway, making all northbound local stops to Capobianco Field (Opposite PS/IS 217).

Return Red Bus service from Manhattan to Roosevelt Island will start at 3:30 PM. This bus will depart on the half hour from the Southwest side of 2nd Avenue, between 58th & 59th Street, and will make all southbound local bus stops (starting with 591 Main Street) to the Tram.

The last trip will depart from the Roosevelt Island Tramway at 7:00 PM. The last trip will

depart Manhattan at 7:30 PM. Please note that regular Red Bus service may run on an adjusted schedule to accommodate the additional Tram shuttle service.
