Seawright Teams Up with The Big Shred NY! Kicked Off at Lenox Hill

Neighborhood House to Empower New Yorkers to Fight Identity Theft as Fraud Losses Nationwide Soar to \$12.5 Billion





"I am proud to team up with AARP-NY on this important shredding event,"said Assembly Member Rebecca A. Seawright, Chair of the Aging Committee and lead sponsor of the elder fraud bill. *"Shredding is a reliable method to help protect against financial scams, particularly those targeting aging adults. I find it unconscionable that so many of our aging neighbors are left vulnerable to devastating financial fraud. That's why I was the lead sponsor of the Elder Fraud bill to enact more robust fraud protection mechanisms. As Aging chair and as Assembly Member of the largest concentration of older adults in Manhattan, I will continue to marshal every resource to protect aging New Yorkers and their hard-earned finances."*

Aging Committee Updates

Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright has introduced the following legislation impaction senior citizens:

- Assembly Bill A.7907 would modify the Expanded In-Home Services for the Elderly Program to eliminate the cost-share requirement for services and eliminate any requirement for the Area Agencies On Aging to obtain a physician's order to provide non-medical support.
- Assembly Bill A.7847 would modify how the New York State Office for the Aging prioritizes
 allocations to counties by taking into account the proportionality of a county's share of elderly
 individuals living in the State. This would ensure New York City gets its fair share of funding for

the population.

- Our work continues on our Elder Fraud bill, Assembly Bill A.7019. A recent AARP Survey found that 88% of New Yorkers 45 and older support this common-sense measure to protect our seniors from malicious scams.
- Assembly Bill A.4628 would require motion picture theatres to provide showings with open motion picture captioning, a common-sense measure to make our movie theatres more accessible statewide to all New Yorkers.

Empire State Child Credit

The New York State Department of Taxation and Finance is issuing supplemental Empire State Child Credit payments to over 1.5 million low- and moderate-income New Yorkers. The 2024–2025 New York State budget provides for an additional payment to eligible taxpayers based on the Empire State child credit. If you qualify for a payment, you don't need to do anything; we will automatically calculate and send you a check for the amount you're entitled to. Energy Affordability Programs

The NYS Energy Affordability Program provides income-eligible consumers with a discount on their monthly electric and/or gas bills. You may be enrolled automatically if you receive benefits from a government assistance program. Regular HEAP Benefit

Health Insurance

New Yorkers can enroll in a Qualified Health Plan by the 15th of the month for coverage starting the 1st of the following month and benefit from new cost-sharing reductions for additional savings. HIICAP





The NYC Department of Design and Construction is managing this project on behalf of the NYC Department of Transportation.

Reconstruction of York Ave. Combined Sewer and Water Main Project

The NYC Department of Design and Construction (NYC DDC) manages the Reconstruction of York Avenue, Combined Sewer and Water Main Project ID# SEN002169, upgrading existing infrastructure facilities along York Avenue, between East 61st Street and East 63rd Street, and on E. 62nd Street between York Avenue and 1st Avenue in the Upper East Side of Manhattan.

The city's scope includes replacing combined sewers, water mains, catch basins, fire hydrants, new street lighting, traffic signal upgrades, and full road restoration. Several of these operations have been delayed due to Con Edison's underground utility work, which requires extreme caution and hand-digging excavations. The anticipated completion date for this project is the summer of 2025. Please find the latest report <u>here</u>.
