



Dear Friends and Neighbors,

Today Governor Hochul signed Executive Order No. 52 to ensure all New Yorkers—including children as young as three, pregnant individuals, and healthy adults under 65—can access the updated 2025–26 COVID-19 vaccine. The order responds to recent federal limits that restricted vaccine availability for certain groups. This 30-day measure helps New Yorkers stay safe and vaccinated while the state develops longer-term solutions.

In this edition of our community update, you will find updates on legislation I strongly supported to ensure that this school year is the best one yet, including increased funding for every school district, free meals for all students, and safer, more focused classrooms.

Expanded COVID-19 Vaccine Access in New York

We hear your concerns about recent federal changes to COVID-19 vaccine guidelines. Politicizing healthcare undermines trust and puts communities at risk. Every New Yorker should have access to recommended vaccines, especially the lifesaving COVID-19 vaccine.

That's why Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright supports critical legislation to protect access:

- AB 8824 Requires insurance coverage for the COVID-19 vaccine.
- AB 3839 Requires insurance coverage for all vaccines.
- AB A8383 Allows the Health Commissioner to provide additional guidance when the FDA approves a vaccine.

Additionally, Governor Hochul's September 5 Executive Order allows pharmacists to administer the COVID-19 vaccine without a prescription, making it easier for New Yorkers—including our most vulnerable—to stay protected this fall and winter.

Immunization is the most effective way to fight infectious diseases. By trusting the science and ensuring equitable access, New Yorkers can help stop the spread and protect our communities.

Back to School with Stronger Support for Students

- More funding for every district: Foundation Aid has increased by at least 2% for every school district, giving schools the resources they need to support students and teachers.
- Free meals for all students: Every child now has access to nutritious school meals, ensuring that no student goes hungry while learning.
- Safer, more focused classrooms: New laws ban cell phones during school hours and set limits on classroom temperatures, creating environments where students can focus, learn, and thrive.

By providing more resources, reducing distractions, and improving classroom conditions, we're building the foundation for better schools and brighter futures for every child in New York. Together, we're making sure this school year is a step forward for students, teachers, and families across our community.

Energy & Heating Assistance

SNAP Benefits: Simplified one-page applications, longer recertification periods for seniors, and no interview needed for recertification. Learn more and apply online.

Health Bucks: At NYC farmers markets, spend \$2 in SNAP/EBT/Summer EBT and get \$2 bonus Health Bucks for fresh produce, up to \$10 per visit. Info: grownyc.org/greenmarket/ebt/nutritionprograms.

Transportation

MTA Reduced-Fare Program: Half-fare benefits are moving to OMNY. New cards should have arrived; continue using MetroCards meanwhile. Check updates at MTA Reduced-Fare OMNY info.

MTA Mobile Sales: Services include reduced-fare applications, OMNY sign-ups, card balance transfers, and lost card reports. Schedule at mta.info/fares/mobile-sales.

Congestion Pricing: Tolls apply entering Manhattan south of 60th St. Discounts and exemptions available. Details: mta.info/discounts and congestionreliefzone.mta.info.




☐ Temporary Closure Notice ☐


Due to entrance door replacement, beginning Friday September 5th through Monday 6am, this entrance will be temporarily non-ADA accessible. Station will remain open for service via temporary entrance and stairs. Elevators will also be in service inside the station.

Weekend Impact (September 5-8, 2025):

The main entrance will be closed to the public. Temporary stairs will be installed for use by non-ADA residents/riders.

ADA access will not be available during this time due to limitations in providing alternate accessible options.

Riders requiring ADA access will be directed to use the Q102 Bus and the Roosevelt Island Tram as alternative routes.
