

September 11, 2001 Remembrance Across the 76th District



On Wednesday evening, Assembly Member Rebecca Seawright joined the community at Carl Schurz Park for the September 11th Remembrance Vigil to honor the 2,977 lives lost, the first responders who ran toward danger, and the families and loved ones whose grief endures.

Seawright co-chaired this important community event with Howard Teich, alongside City Council Member Julie Menin, Community Board 8 Chair Valerie Mason, Pastor Matthew Dayton-Welch, Commandant David Menegon and the Knickerbocker Greys, and the dedicated performers who shared their voices and talents.

As the community stood together in remembrance, Seawright highlighted the extraordinary courage of firefighters, EMTs, police officers, and ordinary citizens who rose in extraordinary ways twenty-four years ago. Many of these heroes are part of the Eastside community, and their service is deeply appreciated.

In the days after September 11th, New Yorkers came together with resilience, compassion, and an unbreakable spirit. At this year's vigil, Seawright reaffirmed the vow to never forget.


