

Museums

The Museum of Modern Art seniors pay \$14 instead of the typical \$20 entrance fee.

The Metropolitan Museum of Art seniors pay \$22 instead of the typical \$30 entrance fee. (Payment Optional) 1000 5th Ave, New York, NY 10028

The American Museum of Natural History seniors over 60 years old pay \$22 instead of the \$28 entrance fee.

200 Central Park W, New York, NY 10024

The Intrepid Museum has a small discount for seniors over 65 years old, allowing them to pay \$34 instead of \$36.

Pier 86, W 46th St, New York, NY 10036

The 9/11 Museum allows seniors over 65 years old to also receive a discount for general admission, costing \$27 instead of \$33.

420 W 14th St Fl 2, New York, NY 10014

Nature & Recreation

Seniors over 62 years old can purchase lifetime tickets to **national parks**, nature refuges, national historic sites, and national monuments for \$80. Call 888-275-8747 for more information on this.

Hunting and fishing permits are discounted to only \$5 for seniors over 70 years old.

Seniors over 65 pay \$31 instead of \$35 for admission to the **New York Botanical Gardens**.

Energy & Heating Assistance

Food Assistance

SNAP Benefits: Simplified one-page applications, longer recertification periods for seniors, and no interview needed for recertification. Learn more and apply online.

Health Bucks: At NYC farmers markets, spend \$2 in SNAP/EBT/Summer EBT and get \$2 bonus Health Bucks for fresh produce, up to \$10 per visit. Info: grownyc.org/greenmarket/ebt/nutritionprograms.

Transportation

MTA Reduced-Fare Program: Half-fare benefits are moving to OMNY. New cards should have arrived; continue using MetroCards meanwhile. Check updates at MTA Reduced-Fare OMNY info.

MTA Mobile Sales: Services include reduced-fare applications, OMNY sign-ups, card balance transfers, and lost card reports. Schedule at $\underline{\text{mta.info/fares/mobile-sales}}$.

Congestion Pricing: Tolls apply entering Manhattan south of 60th St. Discounts and exemptions available. Details: mta.info/discounts and congestionreliefzone.mta.info.


