New Laws

New state laws go into effect every month. Here are the new laws taking effect in June 2023:

6/1/2023	Ch. 754 of 2022 A.8630-A S.8291-A Ch. 15 of 2023 A.619 S.1340	Prohibits the sale of any cosmetic product or personal care product containing mercury, other than in trace amounts allowed by the Food and Drug Administration as unavoidable under conditions of good manufacturing practice or necessary for use as a preservative in the absence of an effective and safe nonmercurial preservative substitute.
6/1/2023	Ch. 676 of 2022 A.8869-B S.7658-B Ch. 65 of 2023 A.2207 S.2231	Prohibits an insurer from cancelling, refusing to issue, refusing to renew, or increasing the premium of a policy or to exclude, limit, restrict, or reduce coverage under such policy solely on the basis that one or more claims have been made against any policy during the preceding 60 months for a loss that is the result of a hate crime.
6/1/2023	Ch. 57 of 2023 PART L A.3007-C S.4007-C	Relates to site of service clinical review for determining whether a non-urgent outpatient medical procedures and surgeries procedure will be covered when rendered by a network participating provider at a hospital-based outpatient clinic.

6/1/2023	Ch. 59 of 2023 Part R A.3009-C S.4009-C	Extends the sales tax exemption for certain sales made through vending machines.
6/2/2023	Ch. 56 of 2023 Subpart A A.3006-C S.4006-C	Clarifies the process for setting bail or non-monetary conditions.
6/7/2023	Ch. 667 of 2022, §§ 1 and 2 A.8006 S.7626 Ch. 116 of 2023 A.4016 S.1349	Authorizes residents of assisted living programs to receive hospice services.
6/7/2023	Ch. 672 of 2022 A.1236-A S.4844-B	Expands the rights of nursing employees by requiring an employer, upon request, to designate an appropriate location for employees to express breast milk and forbidding employers from retaliating against employees for exercising this right.

6/13/2023	Ch. 677 of 2022 A.3241 S.6721 Ch. 24 of 2023, §1 A.966 S.1341	Authorizes each local government to initiate receivership proceedings when there is a property maintenance condition that threatens the public's health, safety, and welfare.
6/14/2023	Ch. 688 of 2022 A.911-A S.947-A	Strengthens penalties for operating a vessel while intoxicated when a child who is 15 years of age or less is a passenger in such vessel.
6/14/2023	Ch. 690 of 2022 A.3714 S.5097-A	Requires the disclosure of indoor mold history upon the sale of residential real property.
6/14/2023	Ch. 701 of 2022 A.9974 S.8869	Requires hospitals and ambulatory surgical centers to use airborne contaminants evacuation systems that protect patients and staff from lung damage and other health risks that may result from airborne surgical contaminants.
6/19/2023	Ch.722 of 2022 A.10020-A S.8922-A Ch. 43 of 2023 A.1000 S.851	Enacts the Warehouse Worker Protection Act to protect employees from unreasonably demanding work quotas and inform them of their rights in the workplace.

6/21/2023	Ch. 763 of 2022 A.8275-A S.660-A	Requires the Department of Transportation and the Department of Environmental Conservation to develop policies and procedures to encourage use of native plants that are pollinator friendly in state and local highway medians.
6/21/2023	Ch. 764 of 2022 A.3470-C S.2521-C	Requires notice to patients prior to hospitals and professional practices charging patients for facility fees, including whether the patient's health coverage will cover the fee.
6/21/2023	Ch. 768 of 2022 A.7876-A S.5472-A Ch. 22 of 2023 A.631 S.1335	Requires residential leases to provide notice of information concerning flood insurance and include information on prior flood damage due to a natural flood event.

6/26/2023	Ch. 806 of 2022 A.9920 S.8442 Ch. 106 of 2023 A.2890 S.823	Requires the Office for People With Developmental Disabilities to process applications and make eligibility determinations and service authorizations in a timely manner.
6/26/2023	Ch. 812 of 2022 A.9542 S.8903 Ch. 90 of 2023 A.4137 S.855	Establishes a state-level program of all-inclusive care for the elderly for persons 55 years of age or older, qualifying for nursing home levels of care who wish to remain in their community.
6/26/2023	Ch. 790 of 2022 A.355-A S.4013-A Ch. 98 of 2023, §1 A.603 S.1338	Requires notice to members of the state legislature and New York City Council relating to certain construction and other projects affecting members' districts.

Also directs the Department of Labor to establish an enforcement officer to oversee and prompt investigations into any complaints of violations and requires each health care employer to make a good faith effort to have overtime covered on a voluntary basis.</p>
