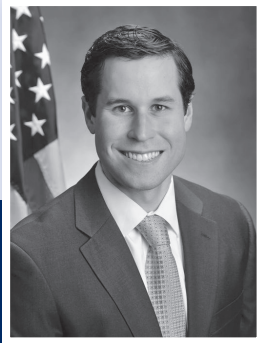
# Local Issues, *Real Results.*

## **Provided Oversight for East Ramapo School District**

Ken has been fighting for State oversight of the East Ramapo School District and was recently successful as the State appointed a fiscal monitor to oversee the District. This fiscal monitor will audit the District's finances and work to restore educational opportunities for the kids.

## **Stop the Chicken Slaughterhouse**

Ken has called on the State to rescind the \$1.6 million grant for a proposed chicken slaughterhouse in the Village of New Square. This project is inappropriately located near residential homes and its industrial use will negatively impact the quality of life of Rocklanders. Over 2,000 residents joined him on the letter demanding that the State cancel its funding commitments for the project.

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## **Bi-State Flood Mitigation Act**

Rockland has been plagued by unnecessary flooding for years and coordinated efforts are needed to prevent it. Ken passed legislation that created a bi-state task force made up of residents and local governments which will work to develop an action plan in order to mitigate flooding. This task force of experts will provide fresh ideas to improve water management between our states and prevent flooding of homes.

## **Fighting Illegal Housing in Rockland**

Illegal housing and a lack of code enforcement is putting residents, first responders, and home values at risk. Ken brought the Department of State down to Rockland to inspect various properties in municipalities that are not enforcing building codes. Ken has called for a formal investigation with public hearings to protect all Rocklanders.
