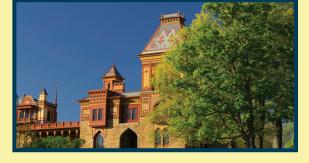

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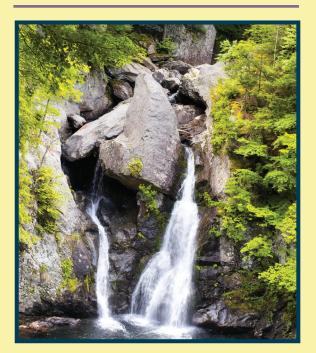

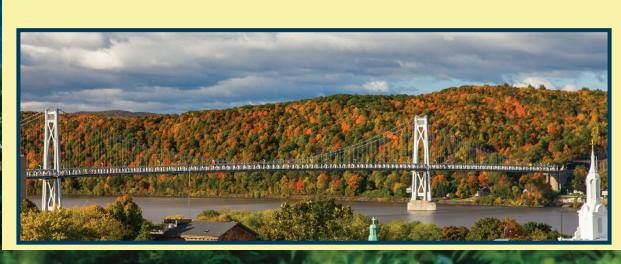

# PROTECT YOURSELF FROM LYME AND OTHER TICK-BORNE DISEASES

New York State is experiencing longer and more severe tick seasons, with the majority of tick-to-human bites occurring in the warmer months when ticks are most active. You can protect yourself and your family by taking the proper precautions when enjoying the great outdoors. Wear light colors to help spot ticks and tuck long pants into socks to prevent ticks from clinging to your legs. If your family is comfortable, consider using a tick repellent. If hiking, stay on the path and avoid walking through brush and tall grass. Once indoors, check your clothes and body thoroughly, shower to wash off any ticks that are crawling on your skin and dry your clothes on high heat to dry out and kill any ticks you may have missed as soon as you get home.
