Dear Mr. Coscia:

We would like to extend our gratitude to Amtrak and the NYS Department of Transportation for changes and progress made on the railway system to date. Due to stakeholder feedback, we urge you to please consider the following to minimize negative impacts on riders from recent developments:

- Move the northbound Adirondack's additional layover to Saratoga Springs. This will ensure that passengers en route to Schenectady and Saratoga have shorter delays on their trips.
- Run the Adirondack and Maple Leaf as separate trains on Saturday and Sunday when Amtrak does not have high levels of New Jersey Transit commuter trains operating. This provides additional separate departure times needed to meet demand on the busy weekends.
- Run Albany to Poughkeepsie shuttle trains to connect with Metro North Railroad.
- Ask Metro North Railroad to allow Amtrak to push back the departure of the 4:30 PM train from Albany so as to reduce the three-hour service gap southbound. Metro North Railroad operates a number of non-revenue service trips southbound to Croton-Harmon and Grand Central Terminal at the end of the evening rush-hour for storage and later evening trips northbound, limiting slots for Amtrak.

We realize that this is a challenging time, but we believe that the implementation of our recommendations can offset the negative impacts from service reductions. The success of the Rensselaer train station over the generations is not one to be lost.

We would like to add that we are aware of an issue that resulted in the removal of a set of Horizon series cars from service. We understand that as a result New York lost the cars that were going to lengthen the Maple Leaf and one trainset in the Hudson Valley after April 28<sup>th</sup>. We hope that equipment shifts are leveraged to address this problem as ridership continues to grow.
