Legislative Updates

Protecting New Yorkers from the Dangers of Online Sports Betting

Last week, I held a joint hearing with Assemblywoman Carrie Woerner, Chair of the Assembly Racing and Wagering Committee, to examine the dramatic rise in gambling addiction due to the proliferation of online sports betting. Following the legalization of mobile sports betting in 2022, the New York State Office of Addiction Services and Supports (OASAS) reported the largest single-year increase in gambling treatment services. Additionally, mobile sports betting has now surpassed casino gambling as the primary reason for gambling-related helpline calls made by New Yorkers.

At the hearing, we heard expert testimony from multiple professors who have studied this issue, individuals with lived experiences of gambling addiction, and organizations pursuing policy changes. The Executive Director of the New York State Gaming Commission also provided testimony regarding the legal and regulatory process that sports wagering operators must go through to operate in New York State.

While I review the testimony of each witness and introduce legislation based on their recommendations in the coming months, I will continue to advance common-sense measures to increase accessibility to problem gambling services and establish guardrails on sports betting platforms to protect users, including legislation that:

- Increases the distribution for problem gambling education and treatment from \$6 million to \$12 million (A7629)
- Requires insurance companies to cover outpatient problem gambling services (A8518)
- Prohibits mobile sports wagering operators from allowing users to use gift certificates or e-wallets to deposit or withdraw funds (A8724)
- Requires health education to include gambling awareness in addition to mental health, alcohol, drug, and tobacco abuse, and the detection/prevention of certain cancers (A8912)
- Prohibits mobile sports betting platforms from using AI for advertising, tracking user activity, or offering personalized incentives (A8916)
- Prohibits mobile sports wagering advertisements during live sporting events (A8925)
- Prohibits mobile sports wagering operators from allowing more than five deposits from an authorized sports bettor within a 24-hour period (A8928)

I want to thank each witness for providing incredibly insightful testimony to the joint committee. I would also like to thank Chair Woerner and all the members

who participated in the hearing for their commitment to addressing the rise in gambling addiction related to sports betting.

Kratom Regulation

Earlier this year, I introduced legislation to regulate the sale and labeling of kratom products in New York State. Kratom is an unregulated, mind-altering substance that can currently be purchased online or in stores with little to no oversight.

The goal of this legislation is straightforward: to protect consumers by ensuring transparency and safety. New Yorkers deserve to know exactly what they are putting into their bodies.

Albany International Airport Improvements

I recently joined New York State Department of Transportation Commissioner Marie Therese Dominguez at Albany International Airport to celebrate the opening of the airport's new children's play area, sensory room, and business center.

These improvements are part of a \$100 million terminal expansion made possible with \$60 million in state funding through the Upstate Airport Economic Development and Revitalization Competition—an excellent investment in the Capital Region's infrastructure, economy, and accessibility.

It was inspiring to see the creativity and collaboration behind these new spaces, including contributions from the Adirondack Wild Center and sculptor Gracelee Lawrence. The sensory room will provide a calming environment for travelers with disabilities or sensory needs, while the play area will make flying more enjoyable for families.

Thank you to Commissioner Dominguez, airport leadership, and all the partners who helped bring this project to life. I look forward to seeing the full terminal expansion completed and continuing to support smart investments that strengthen our region.



Empowering the Next Generation at the SEAT Center

At SEAT Center in Schenectady, I presented \$75,000 in state funding to support their impactful YouthBuild Schenectady program.

YouthBuild provides young people ages 16–24 with the education, job training, and leadership development they need to build successful futures while giving back to their communities. This latest funding will enhance wraparound services, workforce development, and leadership training that prepare students for high-demand careers.

It was inspiring to hear directly from students about how YouthBuild has transformed their lives and set them on a path to success. Their stories reflect the power of opportunity, mentorship, and perseverance.

Since 2022, my office has secured a total of \$350,000 for SEAT Center through state budget allocations and grants, investments that continue to strengthen their mission and expand opportunities for local youth.

Supporting Inclusion Through Bring on the Spectrum

I recently visited Bring on the Spectrum to see firsthand the impact of their incredible work in our community. Earlier this year, I secured \$30,000 in state funding to support their new A.D.A.P.T. program, which helps youth and community groups learn about neurodiversity and take meaningful steps toward building more inclusive spaces for everyone.

It was inspiring to sit in on one of their classes and see how this program brings people together through understanding and collaboration. I'm proud to continue

supporting Bring on the Spectrum as they lead the way in fostering a community where every individual feels valued, respected, and included.



Investing in Niskayuna's Parks and Youth Program

At Blatnick Park, I stood alongside Town Supervisor Erin Cassady-Dorion, Niskayuna Baseball League President Phil Sidoti, members of the Nisky Baseball League board, and the Town Board to announce \$150,000 in state funding to upgrade the baseball fields.

The improvements will address drainage issues and provide new turf, lighting, and safety enhancements to make the fields more accessible and enjoyable for the many youth leagues that play there each season.

Investing in our local parks and recreation spaces is an investment in our children, families, and the future of our community. I'm proud to continue supporting projects that help Niskayuna grow and thrive.



Honoring 250 Years of the United States Navy

The USS Slater recently hosted a celebration marking the 250th birthday of the United States Navy. On October 13, 1775, the Continental Congress authorized the creation of the Continental Navy, establishing a proud tradition of service and sacrifice that continues to this day.

This event held special meaning for me, as my Legislative Director's father, Captain Alan MacQuoid, served in the Navy for 30 years. His distinguished career included flying P-3 surveillance planes during Operation Desert Storm aboard the USS Kitty Hawk and later planning tactical missions during the Afghanistan War and Operation Iraqi Freedom.




