Assemblyman Angelo Santabarbara: Be Counted in Upstate NY!

Why is it important to count everybody?

New York State receives federal funding each year for hospitals, public schools, transportation, emergency services and more.

Each person not counted costs us federal aid each year.

Conducted every 10 years, the Census provides information on every person living in the United States. This information is used for important economic and social decisions.

In previous census counts, New York State has been undercounted, resulting in the loss of billions in federal funding for our upstate communities. Following the 2010 Census, New York also lost two congressional seats.

How do I fill out the form?

In March 2020, for the first time ever, the U.S. Census Bureau will send mailings with instructions on how to fill out the form online. People can also request paper copies in the mail.

Every household will have the option of responding online, by mail or by phone.
