Local Libraries Receive Funding

Our local libraries are finally getting the funds and support they need to make critical renovations. Of the \$34 million in capital funds for public library construction provided in the budget, nearly \$400,000 is coming to the Clifton Park-Halfmoon and Glenville libraries!


This funding will go far to make urgent renovations and upgrades, such as accommodating users with disabilities, bolstering energy inefficiency, providing internet, computer and other electronic technologies to users with updated electrical wiring, addressing the need for adequate meeting rooms, providing for public access computers and much more.

Additionally, you may remember the passage of my bill for the Ballston Community Public Library in the Assembly in June. On August 23, the governor officially signed this bill (A.7082) into law! The bill will update the laws of 1957 that created the Ballston Community Public Library, ultimately allowing the library to create a district that will enhance fundraising and services. This has been in the works for a long time now, and I'm so excited to see what my hometown library will do with this new open door now that it is official!




Family Fun Day
