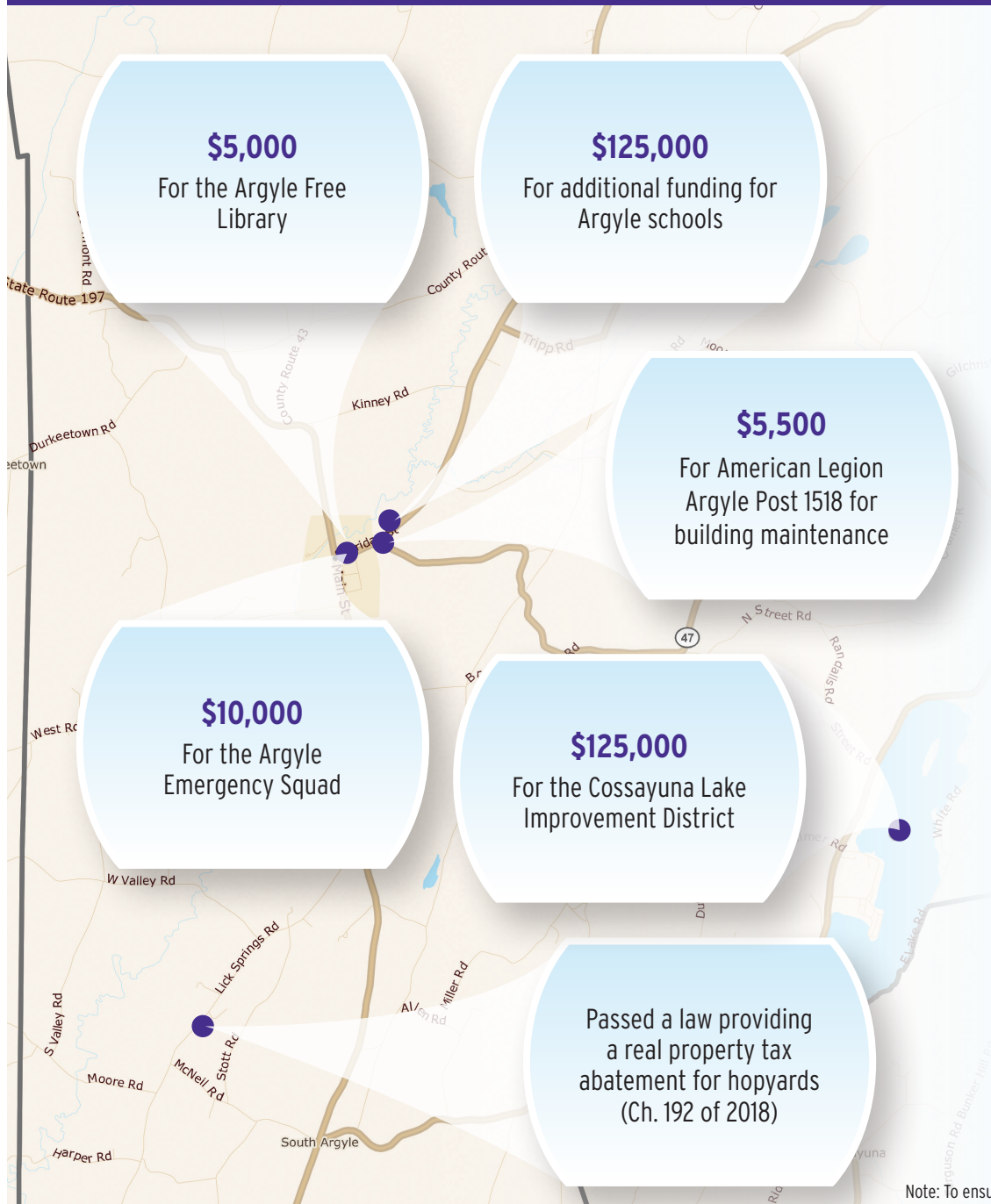

Assemblywoman Woerner: Supporting our communities



Helping Argyle schools

Assemblywoman Woerner believes that every student deserves a quality education that prepares them for a bright future. That's why she secured \$100,000 in additional funding for local schools in 2016, as well as \$25,000 in 2017.



Boosting public safety

Assemblywoman Woerner will always put the safety of Argyle families first and helped provide \$10,000 to the Argyle Emergency Squad for the purchase of a power-operated stretcher in 2018.

Supporting local veterans

Assemblywoman Woerner helped secure \$5,500 for American Legion Argyle Post 1518 in 2017 for building maintenance, including the septic system and refinishing the flooring.

Improving local libraries

To expand residents' access to technology and ensure our libraries keep up with the digital age, Assemblywoman Woerner helped secure \$5,000 to provide the Argyle Free Library with updated technology in 2016.

Providing equal opportunities for hops farmers

To level the playing field and ensure the brewing industry can flourish across the state, Assemblywoman Woerner passed a law that establishes hopyards as agricultural land and provides hops farmers with the same opportunities as orchard and vineyard owners to apply for agricultural tax exemptions (Ch. 192 of 2018).



Revitalizing our waterways

Assemblywoman Woerner helped secure \$125,000 in grant funding to purchase weed-harvesting equipment to clean and remove unwanted vegetation on Cossayuna Lake Improvement District.
