

## Assemblywoman Woerner: Supporting our communities



#### \$200,000

For improvements at the city fire station and Mechanicville Area Community Services Center (MACSC)

#### \$125,000

For the purchase and construction of the City Hall parking lot

#### Protecting our community

- Assemblywoman Woerner helped secure investments to enhance public safety, including \$15,000 for the police department to purchase new equipment and body cameras.
- Committed \$200,000 for improvements to the fire station and Mechanic ville Area Community Services Center.
- At the request of the Mechanicville Police Department, she sponsored and passed a law that helps ensure the City of Mechanicville has the police officers needed to protect residents (Ch. 94 of 2017).

#### Helping Mechanicville schools

Ensuring children receive a quality education in a safe environment is essential. To help the Mechanicville City School District achieve this goal, Assemblywoman Woerner secured \$125,000 in additional funding.

#### **Enhancing community resources**

- To ensure public facilities stay up to date, Assemblywoman Woerner helped provide \$125,000 for much-need renovations at City Hall and the police and fire stations.
- She also secured \$125,000 in funding to purchase and construct a parking lot at City Hall.
- To enable the Mechanicville District Public Library the ability to upgrade necessary copier equipment, the Assemblywoman obtained a \$5,000 grant.
