

## ASSEMBLYWOMAN WOERNER IS ADVANCING CRUCIAL LEGISLATION

Assemblywoman Woerner sponsored and passed important legislation that helps our communities, including:

A.898-B – This bill would allow parents of adult children with severe developmental disabilities to continue to receive child support payments until their child is 26 years old.

**A.2396-A** – This measure would streamline the expansion of broadband internet infrastructure into rural communities and ensure these critical services are provided to all New Yorkers in a cost-effective manner.

A.2561-B — This bill would allow air transport ambulances to carry blood and allow emergency medical technicians on-board to perform transfusions and other lifesaving interventions.

**A.4742-B** – This measure establishes the New York State  $250^{th}$  Commemoration Act to recognize the  $250^{th}$  anniversary of the founding of our nation. This will provide funding to local historians and historical sites to commemorate our history.

A.6395-B – This bill requires funds that New York receives from settlements with opioid manufacturers to be placed in an Opioid Settlement Fund and only be used for addiction treatment, recovery and prevention services.

A.6767-A — This measure adds vascular rupture to the list of firefighter injuries that are covered by workers' compensation insurance, allowing individuals or their families to receive death or disability benefits. The bill was prompted by the death of a Whitehall firefighter last year.

## ASSEMBLYWOMAN WOERNER IS WORKING FOR LOCAL FAMILIES

Assemblywoman Woerner helped secure important funding for local communities, including:

- Byrne Grants for de-escalation simulator and training
  - ≠\$25,000 to the Washington County Sheriff
- \$80,000 for the Southern Adirondack Library System to cover extraordinary COVID expenses
- \$45,000 to the Schuylerville Central School District for the FFA technology challenge
- \$40,000 to the Malta Veterans Appreciation Program for veterans housing
- \$20,000 to the Mechanicville Area Community Services Center for the prevention of youth violence
- \$20,000 for the Domestic Violence Rape Crisis Services of Saratoga County/Wellspring
- \$10,000 for the Salem Historic Courthouse Lunch Learn and Play summer learning program

- \$50,000 for Pitney Meadow Community Farm to expand their food security programs
