Assemblywoman Marianne Buttenschon is protecting our environment



To combat climate change and protect Mohawk Valley families, Assemblywoman Buttenschon:

- ✓ Helped pass a budget that **provides an additional \$500 million to protect access to clean water statewide**
- ✓ Implemented the New York State Climate Leadership and Community Protection Act, which will **reduce greenhouse gas emissions, invest in renewable energy and promote environmental justice** (Ch. 106 of 2019)
- ✓ Helped phase out most single-use plastic bags to **keep our neighborhoods and waterways clean** (Ch. 58 of 2019)

Assemblywoman Buttenschon authored and passed a measure designating numerous creeks in the 119th Assembly District as “inland waterways,” which would qualify the communities along the creeks for Local Waterfront Revitalization Program funding (A.6963-A).
