ASSEMBLYWOMAN BUTTENSCHON HELD MEETING WITH STATE AGENCIES REGARDING YOUTH IN CRISIS

119th ASSEMBLY DISTRICT, Mar. 07, 2023- Assemblywoman for the 119th District, Marianne Buttenschon held a meeting with state agencies regarding needs for our youth in crisis.

The meeting was requesting state agency leadership to address the concerns of our justices, school personnel, family members, and providers when it comes to assisting our youth in crisis. In attendance were the Division of Integrated Community Services for Children and Families, the Division of State Operated Services, Legislative Coordinators, the Mohawk Valley Psychiatric Center, Children’s Services, the Central New York Field Office, Mohawk Valley Health Systems, and the Central New York Family Resources (CNYFO).

There has been an increase in cases where children are in hardships and there is a shortage of housing for them. Many of these youths are sent to our local hospitals as a first step and then there is no secure housing for them when they are released. It can be a court matter, a school matter, or a family situation that has escalated.

“We are in need of safe and secure housing for our youth in crisis.” Assemblywoman Buttenschon said.

At least 70% of public schools across the United States have reported an increase in the number of students seeking mental health services at schools since the start of the coronavirus pandemic, data shows (silive.com, 2022). Not only do we see mental health cases rising, but we also see criminal activity increasing within our youth.

Further meetings are scheduled with all agencies involved to further address the district’s needs.

“Our youth are in crisis and need help,” Assemblywoman Buttenschon said. “And victims of an incident deserve to know that the youth are receiving treatment.”

RECOGNITION OF THE 31ST ANNIVERSARY FOR BOSNIA AND HERZEGOVINA INDEPENDENCE DAY

ALBANY, Mar. 1, 2023 - The New York State Assembly recognized March 1st as being Bosnia and Herzegovina Independence Day. This year it is the 31st anniversary for this state holiday.

Bosnian-American Community Association (BACA) was witness to this recognition on the New York State Assembly floor this morning. Assemblywoman Marianne Buttenschon formally announced BACA and introduced three successful Bosnian community members to the New York State Assembly.

The Assembly Resolution designates March 1st as Bosnian Independence Day in the State of New York. During the session, the speaker welcomed BACA to Albany.

The community members included from BACA include a successful business owner, Osman Ruznic, assistant teaching professor, Mirza Tihic and police officer Dino Jukic.

THE NYS ASSEMBLY**



ALBANY, Mar. 28, 2023- Many Resolutions were co-sponsored by Assemblywoman Buttenschon on the Assembly floor this month. The Resolutions Assemblywoman Buttenschon sponsored were K147, K171, K172 and K173. While she sponsored Bills A5073, A608, A613, A4862, A975.

Bills sponsored:

- ♦ relates to the certain offenses and provisions related to the unlawful dissemination of a personal image and relates to a private right of action for such offenses.
- ♦ prohibits mortgagees from requiring mortgagors of certain real property to purchase flood insurance exceeding certain limits.
- ♦ relates to pharmacists administering medications approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration
- ♦ requires the Commissioner of the Office of Mental Health to provide monthly status reports of the community investments and the impact on inpatient census.
- ♦ provides employers with the opportunity to register for emergency alerts from the state of New York public safety alert mass notification system.

- ♦ congratulate the Utica University Men's Ice Hockey Team upon the occasion of capturing the United Collegiate Hockey Conference Men's Ice Hockey Team Championship.
- ♦ congratulate the Section III Girls Gymnastics Team upon the occasion of capturing the NYSPHSAA Girls Gymnastics Team Championship on March 4, 2023.
- ♦ commend Colleen Kain Martin upon the occasion of her designation as Grand Marshal of the 2023 Utica St. Patrick's Day Parade.
