Reading to 3rd Graders

Assemblyman Magnarelli had the honor of reading to 3rd graders at Cathedral Academy at Pompei (Our Lady of Pompei School). As a native of the Northside, Assemblyman Magnarelli attended the elementary school. The school now has students and families originating from 5 continents and 17 nations; many are refugees. Most of its children speak and understand two or more languages, including English. In the early 20th Century, the Northside was home to newly immigrated Italians, Irish and Germans, then in the 1970s and 1980s Vietnamese, Laotians, Cambodians and other Southeast Asian peoples moved into this sector. Currently, African, Middle Eastern, and South Central Asian populations have joined the Northside neighborhood.

Assemblyman Magnarelli was happy to join Tai Shaw and many members of our community on Sunday, February 10th at the Vietnamese New Year celebration. The celebration pays respect to ancestors and elders. The Vietnamese Tet Celebration includes traditional Vietnamese cuisine, lion dancing, local singers and performers, carnival games, and many other exciting activities.

Each year, ARISE serves more than 7,000 people from offices located in five Central New York counties: Onondaga, Oswego, Madison, Cayuga, and Seneca. All ARISE programs are consumer directed, maximizing choice and opportunities for the people served.

State Attorney General Visits

On January 26th, Assemblyman Magnarelli welcomed NYS Attorney General Tish James to the Syracuse University College of Law. Prior to being elected NYS Attorney General, Tish James was the Public Advocate for New York City. She is the first woman in New York to be elected Attorney General, the first African-American woman to be elected to statewide office and to serve as Attorney General. The Attorney General spoke to community members, law students and many local elected officials about some of her priorities for 2019.

Assemblyman Magnarelli met with members of the Early Childhood Alliance in Albany to discuss the many benefits of early education and the hurdles yet to overcome so every child is prepared for school.
