

Our public safety is at risk. That is why I am sponsoring the **“Restore Order”** legislation below to help restore public safety in our communities.

★ Restore Judicial Discretion

(A.5265) – Restores judicial discretion to allow judges the ability to determine whether a violent criminal poses a dangerous threat to the community and can be held without bail.

★ Bail for Gun Crimes (A.7066) –

Removes all gun crimes from the no-bail list of offenses established in 2019.

★ Parole Reform (A.5737) –

Requires a unanimous vote of at least three parole commissioners to grant a prisoner early release. Also allows a majority vote of the Legislature to remove a commissioner from the parole board.

★ Three Strikes & You’re In (A.5334)

– Authorizes life in prison without parole for persistent violent felony offenders.

★ Shooting Into Crowds (A.4259) –

Makes it a Class B violent felony to fire into a crowded space with the intent to harm.

★ Additional 5 Years for Possession

(A.4762) – Provides for an additional 5-year term of imprisonment for committing a felony while possessing a loaded firearm.

★ Bail for Hate Crimes (A.3986) –

Makes a hate crime a qualified offense for purposes of bail issuance and denying pre-trial release.

I will continue to support legislation that provides important tools and resources for those in law enforcement, bolsters public safety and protects crime victims and their families.

Thank you to the brave men and women of law enforcement who put their lives on the line every day to protect us, our families, and our local communities.
