

Dear Neighbor,

Autumn is my favorite season and the Finger Lakes region is one of the best places in the world to experience Fall colors and fun! September was a big month, as we transitioned back into school and began to gear up for session in January. September was also Early Intervention Awareness Month, and I was proud to host the <u>Early Intervention Awareness resolution</u> in the Assembly this year.

Early intervention (EI) services are therapies such as speech, physical or occupational therapy that children aged o-3 are legally entitled to if they are failing to reach certain developmental milestones. These services are paid for through the county, with a mix of county and state dollars, to help ensure that kids are healthy and school-ready. After age 3, the school districts pick up the cost of these services if they are still needed. We do not have nearly the number of EI providers necessary to meet the need, and we have tens of thousands of children across the state on waitlists for services. Right here in Monroe County we have, on average, 1,000 kids on the waitlist. This not only fails to meet our legal obligation to these children, but it fails to meet our moral obligation. Children who receive

timely EI services have substantially better outcomes than children who don't; some children go on not to need any services at all as they age. Not only does EI help us build stronger, more independent and resilient kids, but it is a cost-saver over time, as fewer kids need to be pulled out of classrooms for intervention, or go on to require additional physical or occupational support throughout their lives.

In order to help address this crisis, the Kids Can't Wait campaign has been pushing for an 11% increase in EI funding in the state budget. Since entering this office in 2021, we have successfully helped push this increase into the Assembly onehouse budget, only to have it fall out of the final budget during negotiations. This summer, I dedicated my time to broadening the Kids Can't Wait Coalition to include teachers, school administrators, unions, county leaders and advocacy groups to ask the Governor to put this increase in her Executive budget this year. We hosted a very well-attended legislative briefing at the beginning of the month to educate other legislative offices about this issue and the game plan for getting this increase across the finish line this year. We then ended the month with a press conference with Assemblymember Michaelle Solages and our friends in the Black, Puerto Rican, Hispanic & Asian Legislative Caucus, who are joining us in this fight as the EI crisis disproportionately impacts black and brown families. This will be one of our top priorities in the upcoming budget.

We have much more to come this Fall, so stay tuned! I hope to see you at the pumpkin patches.






2024 NYS ASSEMBLY INTERNSHIP PROGRAM






UNCLAIMED FUNDS IN NYS
