Building More Homes

- Modernized the 50-year-old State Environmental Quality Review Act (SEQRA) requirements to cut red tape, eliminate fees, and speed up home development and infrastructure projects (FY'27 Budget)
- Making it easier to buy your first home with increased funding for first-time homebuyers through the State of New York Mortgage Agency. (FY'27 Budget)
- \$20 million to demolish the Terrence Building, the long-vacant former Rochester Psychiatric Center on Elmwood Ave to build up to 500 more housing units. (FY'27 Budget)



Investing in Spaces We Love

- **Rebuilding the historic Highland Park Children's Pavilion** – This pavilion was the historic centerpiece of Frederick Law Olmstead's original 1890 design until it was removed in 1963. With \$3 million to reconstruct this landmark, Highland Park will once again feature this original treasure. (FY'27 Budget)
- **High Falls State Park** – \$75 million to transform 40 acres of brownfields into a state park in the heart of Rochester, along the Genesee River. Construction begins this year! (FY'27 Budget)
- **Transforming the Stadium District** – \$225 million for the Rochester-Monroe Transformation Initiative to revitalize the areas near Red Wings Stadium in downtown Rochester to add housing, recreation, businesses and more! (FY'27 Budget)
- **Rochester Museum & Science Center** – RMSC's beloved Strassenburgh Planetarium will be upgraded with a new roof, putting the stars and planets within reach for the next generation of learners. (FY'27 Budget)

Putting People Before Profits

- **Aid and Incentives for Municipalities (AIM)** – after years of being shortchanged, Rochester will receive an additional \$35 million in AIM funding to close budget gaps, reduce burdens for taxpayers and invest in community initiatives. (FY'27 Budget)
- **Protecting Our Wallets Energy Rebate (POWER) Checks** – One-time rebate to help offset the cost of high utility bills. This fall, 8.2 million NY households will receive up to \$200. (FY'27 Budget)
- **Ratepayer Protection Plan** – Under new regulations, billionaire utility companies cannot pass the buck to customers. Utility CEOs will have their salaries tied to energy affordability goals set by the state – and if a company makes excess profits, that money will be returned to ratepayers. (FY'27 Budget)
