

When others sat silent, Assemblyman Steve Hawley called for an end to Plan 2014 to raise water levels of the lake.

And when others refused to act, he was one of the first elected officials to tour the flooding firsthand and call for a State of Emergency to deliver aid to homeowners and businesses.

Assemblyman Steve Hawley is helping us recover by:

- Voting to release \$10 million in emergency loans to help residents access clean and reliable drinking water (A.7712)
- Sponsored the Lake Ontario-St. Lawrence Seaway Flood Recovery and International Joint Commission Plan 2014 mitigation grant program, a \$45 million relief program for businesses, homeowners, school districts, and local government infrastructure affected by flooding (A.8013a)
- Urging President Trump, in writing, to renegotiate the disastrous Plan 2014
- Soliciting federal aid to the shoreline and pushed Gov. Cuomo to request that President Trump appoint new leadership to the International Joint Commission (IJC)
- Working with state leaders to declare a State of Emergency and deployment of the Army Corps of Engineers, Mobile Command Centers and tens of thousands of sandbags to mitigate flooding
- Successfully fought for legislation to allow a property-tax reduction for residents whose property was affected by flooding and/or erosion
- Voted to establish a relief package aimed at helping business owners restore and replace damaged property, furniture, inventory, supplies and fixtures (A.8013a)
