LOOKING AHEAD



In the upcoming legislative session, Assemblyman Burke plans to introduce bills to:

- Endow the Great Lakes with certain rights to give the ecosystem legal standing to protect it from pollution
- Expand treatment options for veterans and first responders with PTSD and other mental health conditions by establishing medical psilocybin centers and creating a fund to help them access treatment
- Ensure striking workers and their dependents are eligible for Medicaid to prevent management from using the threat of revoked health insurance as a bargaining tool (A.8500)
