Combating the opioid crisis

- Increases funding by \$43 million, for a total of \$213 million, to expand treatment options for those struggling with substance abuse
- ✓ Provides funding for community coalitions, peer supports, recovery programs and family support navigators to keep more people on the road to recovery



Increasing access to affordable health care

- Restores \$78.8 million to stop cuts to Medicaid and \$37.6 million to protect public health programs
- ✓ Safeguards prescriber prevails, giving patients and doctors the final say over medication
- Rejects copayment and premium increases to help keep care affordable

Supporting direct care workers

Provides direct care workers with a wage increase to ensure they can continue caring for our loved ones with illnesses and special needs

Looking out for seniors

- Includes \$13.5 million for long-term care
- Preserves spousal refusal, ensuring couples don't lose their life savings if a spouse needs nursing home care

Assemblymember Wallace also sponsored a new law to help protect seniors by extending the ombudsman program for those living at home under long-term managed care (Chapter 214 of 2017).
