Assemblymember Monica Wallace is working for Western New York

Wallace supported the following bills in the Assembly during the 2019 Legislative Session

Increasing transparency and accountability

Assemblymember Wallace has always served with integrity and worked to ensure the people's interests come first, supporting legislation that:

- ✓ Prevents "golden parachute" severance packages at the expense of taxpayers (A.2480)
- ✓ Increases transparency in political communications (A.4668)
- ✓ Closed a loophole that allowed corporations to circumvent campaign finance donation limits (Ch. 4 of 2019)
- ✓ Protects whistleblowers by expanding their protections in court (A.375)
- ✓ Gave the state comptroller more authority to audit private organizations that are controlled by local governments and have access to public funds, such as industrial development agencies (A.7476)



Protecting consumers' rights and information



In the age of big technology and widespread data abuses, Assemblymember Wallace has fought against data manipulation and exploitation, including:

- ✓ Imposing state level net neutrality to allow open access to the internet (A.2432)
- ✓ Prohibiting the sale of patient information and employment information and requiring credit agencies to offer identity theft protection in the event of a data breach (A.230, A.431, A.2374)
- ✓ Preventing internet providers from using customer information without express consent (A.2420)
- ✓ Requesting that the New York State Department of Education study the use of facial recognition technology in schools and issue guidelines on protection of student data (A.6787-B)

Supporting New Yorkers with disabilities

Assemblymember Wallace is a tireless advocate for individuals with disabilities, and has passed legislation that:

- ✓ Creates a tax credit for accessible and adaptable housing (A.2493)
- ✓ Establishes a small-business tax credit for the employment of individuals with disabilities (A.7475)
- ✓ Requires counties with local emergency management plans to maintain a confidential and voluntary registry of people with disabilities who may require evacuation assistance (A.3923)
