Giving Victims a Seat and a Say

Victims would receive proper notice of parole interviews and be given the clear opportunity to attend and submit impact statements.

(A.5781)

Upholding Sentences for the Most Heinous Crimes

Removes the governor's ability to commute the sentences of individuals serving life without parole for the most grievous offenses. (A.5800)

Protecting Our Children with Stronger Standards

Expands protection to all minors under 18 that were sexually assaulted or killed. (A.5783)
