MAKING VOTING EASIER

Early voting

For many New Yorkers balancing work and home life, finding time to vote on Election Day is nearly impossible. Karen helped enact a law that gives voters nine days to cast their ballot at a time that's most convenient for them (Ch. 6 of 2019).

The 2019-20 state budget includes \$10 million to help counties implement early voting, as well as \$14.7 million to purchase secure electronic polling books and ballot printers to maintain integrity in elections.



When are early voting sites open?

Saturday, Oct. 26 – Sunday, Nov. 3, 2019 Weekdays – Noon to 9 p.m. Weekends – Noon to 6 p.m.

Additional election reforms

In order to protect the integrity of New York's elections and to simplify the voting process, Karen also supported laws that:

- ✓ Combine the state and federal primary dates to cut down on the number of elections (Ch. 5 of 2019)
- ✓ Close the LLC loophole to stop special interests from making nearly unlimited campaign contributions (Ch. 4 of 2019)
- ✓ Permit 16- and 17-year-olds to pre-register to vote (Ch. 2 of 2019)
- ✓ Ensure voter registration information is automatically transferred when you move from one county to another in New York State (ch. 3 of 2019)



Additionally, New York has started the process of amending the state constitution to allow everyone to vote by absentee ballot without needing a reason (A.778).
