is expanding resources for older New Yorkers

To **support older New Yorkers**, Assemblymember McMahon helped pass a state budget that provided:

- \$15 million in community-based support to serve more older adults, help seniors maintain their autonomy and delay future Medicaid costs through proactive care
- **\$300,000** for the Center for Elder Law and Justice, which provides free civil legal services in a wide variety of areas to seniors and other vulnerable populations in Western New York

McMahon also passed legislation to *reform nursing homes* by:

- Reuniting families separated by the COVID-19 pandemic by expanding nursing home visitation rights (*Ch.* 89 of 2021)
- Making provider data in nursing homes and health care facilities public (A.244-A)
- Creating a task force that will study the state of long-term care services and challenges in New York, including issues specifically related to COVID-19 (A.3922-A)

EPIC

The Elderly Pharmaceutical Insurance Coverage (EPIC) **Program** is a New York State program for seniors administered by the Department of Health. It helps more than 330,000 income-eligible seniors aged 65 and older to supplement their out-of-pocket Medicare Part D drug plan costs. Seniors can apply for EPIC at any time of the year. They must be enrolled or eligible to be enrolled in a Medicare Part D drug plan to receive EPIC benefits and maintain coverage. COVID-19 Vaccines

Vaccination remains the best way to protect yourself and reduce the spread of the COVID-19 virus. All seniors 65 and older, and younger individuals with underlying medical conditions, who received a primary series of Pfizer or Moderna vaccines at least 6 months ago, can now receive a free booster shot.
