Dear Neighbor,

I hope this finds you and your family well. My first year as your Assemblymember has been one filled with invaluable lessons, vital coalition building and productive legislative headway that will build a better state for all New Yorkers.

As a state, we've made substantial gains and progress this past year as we continue our economic recovery from Covid-19. The New York State Assembly Majority took great strides to ensure that residents receive the support and resources they need to weather the storm.

Through the legislative funding process, I am proud to have secured \$30,000 for the Massachusetts Avenue Project, \$32,000 for the Belle Center, \$65,000 for the Stop the Violence Coalition, and \$3.8 million for the construction of the Hispanic Heritage Cultural Institute.

This year's state budget provides more than \$814 million in school aid from New York State, and included in that is a \$43.3 million increase in Foundation Aid, totaling \$587.5 million, along with \$16.5 million for Universal Pre-K. This record level of funding will provide Buffalo Public Schools with the resources they need to return all students to full-time, in-person education, and will facilitate an increase in graduation rates as we prepare our next generation to be workforce-

Two bills that I helped to pass will protect homeowners and renters from the dangers of lead-based paint. Currently, the Department of Financial Services allows insurance companies to write general liability policies that specifically exclude lead poisoning claims from their coverage. Bill A.7488 requires that liability coverage includes injuries or damage caused by exposure to lead paint.

Bill A.6608A, or the "Lead-based Paint Disclosure Act," requires property owners to conduct lead paint tests and provide the reports of such tests before selling or leasing the property. This bill will also give state health officials the knowledge of which properties do and do not have lead paint hazards.

In order to safeguard health care workers and improve nursing homes, legislation passed this session focuses on quality improvement, oversight and transparency, and enforcement. Additional bills passed (A.108-B, A.7119) will set and enforce safe staffing ratios in nursing homes and hospitals across the state.

To bolster resettlement opportunities for refugees, Sen. Sean Ryan and I helped secure \$3 million in funding for refugee resettlement agencies through the New York State Enhanced Services to Refugees Program (NYSESRP). This funding is \$2 million more than last year's allocation of \$1 million for the program.
